#### BE OVERWHELMED

Have you ever been so grateful for something - time with a cherished friend, a special gift, remission of serious illness, a particularly beautiful day or moment in time - that you were completely overwhelmed?

#### FAITH AND GRATITUDE GO HAND IN HAND

Jesus healed ten lepers. Nine presumably did what Jewish law prescribed and what Jesus instructed them to do, presenting themselves to the priests who would witness their healing. Only one, a Samaritan outsider, was so overcome with gratitude that he rushed back to Jesus and fell at his feet, praising God for the incredible gift he had been given. Jesus' response assured him not only that his healing was real but that his faith had saved him. Faith and gratitude go hand in hand in this encounter with the Lord, as it should for us today.

#### SEE GRACE IN YOUR MIDST

Faithful and faith-filled living leads us to be aware of our blessings and to grow in gratitude for them, even in the darkest of times. Those who struggle with physical illness may be challenged to be grateful until they think about the skill their doctor or the companionship of a friend; recalling a special moment with a deceased parent or sibling may console us in grief; a time of loneliness may lead us to quiet prayer and new insight, for example. Living gratefully helps us to see God's hand in our lives.

#### **EVEN WHEN IT IS HARD**

Growing in gratitude is simple, but for most of us, it takes conscious effort at first. Each time we are tempted to whine, focus on what we want rather than what we may actually need, or look at all that is not the way we wish it were, we must turn our minds instead toward the many ways in which we have been blessed. Over time this gratefulness mindset becomes more natural.


#### STEWARDSHIP: GRACE IN ACTION

Like the leper who returned to give thanks, we are called to express our gratitude in words and actions. This grateful response is what stewardship is all about. A steward cares for, nurtures, and shares all that has been entrusted to him or her out of gratitude for the abundant gifts that have been given.

#### HOW WILL YOU BE A GOOD STEWARD?



# CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT WORKING ON THE MARGINS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our diocese will soon take up the national collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). Your support for this collection November 15/16 brings change to communities across the country and empowers those living in poverty to transform their communities into reflections of the Kingdom of God. For more than 50 years, CCHD has helped low-income people address the root causes of poverty and injustice, not by giving "one-size-fitsall" handouts, but by funding local organizations that empower low-income people to make positive impacts in their own communities. This grassroots model allows people to use their experiences and knowledge of their communities to build coalitions of faith leaders, local businesses, and other neighbors who work together to find solutions that benefit everyone.

When you give to the CCHD collection, you make an impact nationally and at home, because 25% of your contribution stays within your own diocese. This way you help your own community build on this legacy of success while also helping communities across the country. Local grant recipients in our diocese include emergency assistance and food pantry supplies for St. Vincent De Paul chapters, vocational job training for adults with disabilities, and community outreach programming for at-risk youth and families. ### Please contact Governor Pritzker to VETO SB 1950-Legalizing Assisted Suicide

At 2:54am on October 31, the Illinois State Senate narrowly passed SB 1950. The State House narrowly passed the bill in the Spring. The bill is now on the Governor's desk. This is the last chance to stop assisted suicide from becoming law in Illinois.


In Canada, where assisted suicide has been legal since 2016, 1 in 20 deaths are now due to assisted suicide/euthanasia. Too many are giving up on life under this law.

#### PLEASE CALL GOVERNOR PRITZKER AND INFORM HIM:

- People with disabilities, the poor and marginalized fear coercion and abuse under assisted suicide laws.
- Suicide rates increase in states where assisted suicide is legal, especially among veterans.
  - There is a possible cost savings to insurance companies, as they can provide cheaper lethal drugs instead of lifesaving treatments.
